Canning & Clyde Quiz – change of date

Council proposals to possible changes in Elgin, Havelock, Outram, Ashburton Roads

I just thought you may like to know what is happening locally with traffic proposals.

Croydon Council have not informed us about these. I came across them yesterday elsewhere.

In order to try and calm and/or reduce cars using these roads as a short cut, Croydon Council is essentially proposing to install pinch points along Elgin, Havelock, Outram and Ashburton Roads to make it harder for cars to pass so making the roads less attractive to through traffic.

If these proposals were to happen, there may be some increase in southbound traffic in Clyde and Canning Roads. It's not possible to say how much but I'm guessing it

wouldn't be as much as the Council's previous proposals would have generated. The Council did not go ahead with these owing to the level of local opposition.
