The Leslie Arms – update from Councillors

Negotiations between the owner and Croydon Council are nearing completion. The proposal is for the front area of the ground floor to be a community cafe. Because of the building's nationally listed status (Grade 2), the owner will work with Heritage England to restore the bar area to its original appearance; the owner will also work with Heritage England on the appearance of the outside of building. The rear area on the ground floor will be a community space. The upper floor will be residential.

Voter photo ID needed to vote from May 2023

Although there are currently no elections scheduled for this year, people need to be prepared in advance. The Government has brought in legislation so that anyone without photo ID or voter ID (called a Voter Authority Certificate) will not be allowed to vote in local or national elections.

Forms of photo ID that are accepted are:

Passport

Driving licence (including provisional license) i.e. not old-style driving licences that don't have a photo

Blue badge

Certain concessionary travel cards

Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)

Biometric Immigration document

Defence identity card

Certain national identity cards

There are plenty of people who do not have one of these forms of photo ID. In order to be able to vote those people have to apply to Croydon Council for a free Voter Authority Certificate. They can do this either online or get a paper application form from the Council.

Things to see / hear in the month of March

Coltsfoot

Coltsfoot is a yellow flower that appears in March and April. It looks quite like a small dandelion. Coltsfoot grows in a variety of places, including gardens and between cracks in pavement and tarmac.

It has long been used as a cough remedy. A Scottish name for it is TushyLucky. This is said to be a corruption of the Latin word 'tussilago' for a cough.

Coltsfoot is an early source of nectar for honey bees and for moth larvae.
